1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical Mode).
2. This is a bail application U/S.483 of BNSS by the petitioners for grant of bail in connection with Jonk PS Case No.156 of 2025 corresponding to ST Case No.86 of 2025 pending in the file of learned District & Sessions Judge, Nuapada for commission of offences punishable U/Ss.309(6) of BNS, on the main allegation of committing robbery of Rs.2,500/- and a Samsung Galaxy A-14 Smart Mobile Phone from the informant.
3. Heard, Mr.Braja Kishore Panda, learned counsel for the petitioners and Mr. C.Mohanty, learned Additional Public Prosecutor in the matter and perused the record.
4. After having considered the rival submissions and taking into consideration the nature and gravity of the offences as alleged against the petitioners vis-à-vis the accusations sought to be brought against them and



regard being had to the pre trial detention of the Petitioners in custody since 22.07.2025 with submission of charge sheet in the meantime, but no criminal antecedent of similar nature having been reported against any of the petitioners and keeping in view recovery of such stolen cash and mobile phone, this Court without expressing any view on merits admits the petitioners to bail.

5. Hence, the bail application of the petitioners stands allowed and the petitioners are allowed to go on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.25,000 /- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand) each with two solvent sureties for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin of the case on such terms and conditions as deem fit and proper by it with following conditions:-

(i) the petitioners shall report attendance before the jurisdictional Police Station once in a fortnight preferably on a Sunday in each month in between 10 A.M. to 12 Noon for six(06) months from the actual date of their release from the custody.

The I.I.C. of Jurisdictional Police Station shall not detain the petitioners unnecessarily after recording their attendance beyond the time as stipulated.

6. Accordingly, the BLAPL stands disposed of.
