- 02.** 1. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner, learned counsel for the State and learned counsel for the Informant.
2. The Petitioner is seeking pre-arrest bail in connection with C.T. Case No.1785 of 2025 pending on the file of learned J.M.F.C., Soro, Balasore, arising out of Soro P.S. Case No.924 of 2025 for commission of offences punishable under Sections 85/ 89/ 109(1)/ 115(2)/ 296/ 351(3)/ 3(5) of BNS read with Section 4 of DP Act.
3. It is submitted by the learned counsel for the Petitioner that omnibus allegations have been made. Hence, the Petitioner may be protected by pre-arrest bail.



4. Learned counsel for the State as well as informant oppose the prayer for pre-arrest bail.

5. Taking into account the nature of allegation and the manner thereof, this Court is not inclined to entertain the application for pre-arrest bail. However, it is directed that Petitioner may surrender before the learned J.M.F.C., Soro, Balasore in connection with the aforementioned case within one month from today.

In the event of his surrender and motion for bail, the same be considered by the learned J.M.F.C., Soro, Balasore on merits, in the first hour of the day.

In the event of rejection of the prayer for bail by the learned J.M.F.C., Soro, Balasore, the Petitioner is at liberty to move the higher forum for bail in the second hour on the same day.

6. On being so moved, the higher forum is requested to make an endeavor to dispose of the bail application of the Petitioner on the same day.

The case diary shall be made available to the concerned courts to facilitate disposal of the bail application of the Petitioner and learned J.M.F.C., Soro, Balasore is called upon to transmit the case record to the higher forum at the earliest in the event of rejection of such bail application.



Ground of parity, if any, may be considered by the learned court(s) below.

7. Accordingly, the ABLAPL stands disposed of.
