1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical Mode).
2. This is the 2nd bail application U/S.483 of the BNSS by the petitioner for grant of bail in connection with District Mobile Unit, Kandhamala, Phulbani PR No.149 of 2022-23 corresponding to 2(a)CC Case No.16 of 2023 pending in the Court of learned Special Judge, Phulbani, for commission of offence punishable U/Ss.20(b)(ii)(B) of the NDPS Act.
3. Heard, Mr. Ranjan Durga, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. C. Mohanty, learned Additional Public Prosecutor in the matter and perused the record.
4. Admittedly, this is a bail jump matter, but the petitioner is in custody since 11.11.2025. The allegation against the petitioner is for possessing 10Kgs of Contraband Ganja, but he was granted bail by this Court in BLAPL No.4030 of 2023. It is also not in dispute that the petitioner has voluntarily surrendered



in the Court. In such view of the matter, this Court by taking a lenient view admits the petitioner to bail.

5. Hence, the bail application of the petitioner stands allowed and the petitioner is allowed to go on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand) only with two solvent sureties each for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin of the case on such terms and conditions as deem fit and proper by it with following conditions:-

(i) The petitioner shall cooperate in the trial by attending the Court on each date of posting unless his attendance is dispensed with by the learned trial Court and

(ii) In case the petitioner fails without sufficient cause to appear in the Court in accordance with the terms of the bail, the learned trial Court may proceed against the Petitioner for offence U/S.269 of BNS, 2023 in accordance with law.

6. Accordingly, the BLAPL stands disposed of.
