1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual/Physical Mode).
2. Since these two bail applications arise out of one and same case record, the same are heard together and disposed of by this common order with the consent of the learned counsel for the parties.
3. These are applications U/S. 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarika Surakshya Sanhita, 2023 (in short, "BNSS") by the petitioners for grant of bail in connection with Ranapur P.S. Case No.307 of 2025 arising out of Special G.R. Case No.88 of 2025 pending in the Court of learned Special Judge-cum-Sessions Judge, Nayagarh for commission of offences punishable U/Ss.20(b)(ii)(B)/25 of the NDPS Act, on the main allegation of possessing 6.500Kgs of Contraband Ganja.



4. Heard, Mr. Karunakar Gaya, learned counsel for the petitioners and Mr. A. Pradhan, learned Addl. PP in these matters and perused the record.

5. After having considered the rival submissions and taking into consideration the nature and gravity of the offences as alleged against the petitioners vis-à-vis the accusations sought to be brought against them and regard being had to the pre-trial detention of the petitioners in custody since 06.10.2025 and the quantity of Contraband Ganja allegedly seized in this case being intermediate quantity and thereby, the embargo of the provisions of Section 37 of NDPS Act being not attractable, this Court without expressing any view on merits, admits each of the petitioners to bail.

6. Hence, these two bail applications of each of the petitioners namely Antaryami Nayak @ Ananta (BLAPL No. 12016 of 2025) and Akshay Kumar & Prince P. (BLAPL No. 12534 of 2025) stand allowed and the petitioners are allowed to go on bail on furnishing bail bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Thousand) each with two solvent sureties for the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned Court in seisin of the case, on such terms and conditions as deem fit and proper by it.

7. Accordingly, these BLAPLs stand disposed of. Issue urgent certified copy of the order as per Rules.
