Petition prayer reads as under:

“The petitioner therefore prays that the hon'ble court be pleased to admit this writ application and after hearing the petitioner's advocate issue a writ in the nature of mandamus or any other suitable writ directing the opposite parties for disbursal of family pension of Late Charu Das Ahmed which is due from the month of Aug 2023 to till Mar 2025.

2. Petition is preceded by a representation dated 05.05.2025 at Annexure-11, which reads as under:

The Office of Account General (A&E)
Odisha, Bhubaneswar.*

Sub: Disbursal of Family Pension Amount to the Legal Heirs of Charu Das Ahmed PRO No: 363387 TS No; 25856

Respected Sir,

We, Farookh Ahmed & Falak Ahmed (s/o of Charu Das Ahmed) humbly state that Charu Das Ahmed w/o Sheikh Faiz Ahmed, passed away on 5th July 2023. Upon her death her family pension was supposed to have been given to her husband Sheikh Faiz Ahmed.



But due to the mis-match in her name in the PPG Account & her Death Certificate, the Pension was not disbursed to Sheikh Faiz Ahmed.

We have provided affidavits from Charu Das & Sheikh Faiz Ahmed to state that Charu Das & Charu Das Ahmed are the same person.

Since her husband Sheikh Faiz Ahmed also deceased on 6th March 2025. We, Farookh Ahmed & Falak Ahmed, humbly request that the family pension including interest from Aug 2023 till March 2025 accrued in favour of Sheikh Faiz Ahmed, may be disbursed to the Legal Heir of Charu Das

The approx amount Is Rs 3,54,973/- + Interest

3. Learned AGA Mr. Lenka is agrees with the suggestion of this Court that the subject representation should meet its fate at the hands of OP No.2 in accordance with law and within a period of eight weeks. He caveats that all contentions should be kept open. I agree.

In the above circumstances, petition is disposed off. Time for consideration and to inform the petitioners in writing the result of such consideration, is eight (8) weeks. All contentions are kept open.

It is open to solicit any information or document from the side of petitioners or from other officers, as are required for due consideration of the subject representation; however, in that guise delay shall not be brooked.
