1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel appearing for the Opp. Parties.
3. Petitioner has filed the present writ petition inter alia with the following prayer:-

“The Petitioner therefore prays that the Hon'ble Court may kindly be pleased to admit the writ petition and to issue a "RULE NISI" to the Opp. parties to show cause as to

Why the Ops will not be directed to resume GPF subscription under the Petitioner's original GPF Account with all consequential entries within a stipulated time and any other order as deem fit be passed.

And if the Opp. parties do not show cause then the rule be made absolute by issuing writ(s)/direction(s) and any other order as deem fit be passed.

And for which act of kindness the counsel in the duty bound shall ever pray.”



4. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner to make a fresh representation before Opp. Party No. 1 by enclosing all the relevant documents and citations in support of her claim, if any, within a period of three (3) weeks hence.

5. It is observed that if such representation is filed within the aforesaid time period, Opp. Party No. 1 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by Opp. Party No. 1 be communicated to the Petitioner.

6. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
