- 1.** This matter is taken up through Hybrid Mode.
- 2.** Heard learned counsel for Petitioner and learned counsel for the State-Opposite Parties.
- 3.** The present Writ Petition has been filed *inter alia* with the following prayer:-

“The petitioner therefore prays that your lordships may graciously be pleased to consider the representation of the petitioner under Annexure-4 and direct the Opp. Parties authority to step up the pay of the petitioner in the same scale of pay drawn by Sri Budhibaman Nayak, Amin as on 01.01.2016 to till date and to calculate the arrear dues of the petitioner, so also the entitlement of the petitioner for the purpose of grant of all benefit and to release the same within a stipulated period as the petitioner is a Govt. servant and has no other source of income other than depending upon his pay benefits for maintenance of self and family members with all consequential service & financial benefits within a stipulated time.



And pass such order(s)/direction(s) as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper

And for this act of kindness, the Petitioner as in duty bound shall ever pray."

4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the Petitioner state that highlighting his grievances, the Petitioner has made a representation to Opposite Party No.2 vide Annexure-4 and the same may be directed to be considered within a stipulated time, to which learned Counsel for the State has no objection.

5. As agreed by learned counsel for the parties and after going through the records, this Court, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, disposes of the Writ Petition directing Opposite Party No.2 to consider the representation filed by the petitioner vide Annexure-4 in accordance with law within a period of three (3) months from the date of production of certified copy of this order.

Accordingly, the Writ Petition stands disposed of.
