1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
 2. Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the records.
 3. The present Criminal Miscellaneous Case has been filed by the Petitioner with a prayer to quash the entire criminal proceeding initiated against him in connection with Banki P.S. Case No.151 of 2025, corresponding to S.T. No.239 of 2025, arising out of G.R. Case No.209 of 2025, pending in the court of the learned District & Sessions Judge, Cuttack.
 4. Learned counsel for the Petitioner, at the outset, contended that the Petitioner does not want to press this application and seeks



permission to withdraw the same with liberty to raise all the points at later stage by filing an appropriate application.

5. Considering such submission, this CRLMC stands disposed of as withdrawn with the liberty as sought for.

6. Further, taking into consideration the submission made by the learned counsel for the Petitioner that the Petitioner is ready and willing to appear before the trial court and cooperate with the trial, it is directed that if the Petitioner surrenders before the court in seisin over the matter within a period of three weeks from today and moves an application for bail, the court in seisin over the matter shall consider and dispose of the bail application of the Petitioner in accordance with law on the same day strictly on the basis of the materials on record. It is further directed that the Case Diary as well as relevant materials be placed before the court concerned on the date of surrender of the Petitioner for consideration of bail application of the Petitioner.
