1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner as well as learned counsel for the State. Perused the application as well as the prayer made therein.
3. Learned counsel for the Petitioner at the outset contended that the Petitioner-wife as an informant lodged the F.I.R. alleging commission of an offence punishable under Sections 498(A), 294, 323, 506, 34 of I.P.C. and Section 4 of D.P. Act. Though, in the meantime charge sheet has been filed, however, the trial has been commenced. He further submitted that the Petitioner-wife is residing separately for last ten years. In such view of the matter, learned counsel for the Petitioner submitted that the informant does not want



to proceed further in the present criminal case.

4. Considering the aforesaid facts, this Court is inclined to issue notice.

5. Learned Additional Standing Counsel accepts notice on behalf of the Opposite Party No.1, extra copy of the application be served on him within three working days.

6. Issue notice to the Opposite Party No.2 by Speed Post with A.D. by fixing a short returnable date. Requisites be filed within three working days.

7. List this matter in the week commencing from 2nd February, 2026.
