01. 1. This matter is taken up through hybrid arrangement.
2. This matter was not in today's list. On being mentioned, this matter is taken up through Special Notice.
3. In filing this Writ Petition, the Petitioner alleged to be an encroacher has challenged the notice of eviction dated 29.11.2025 issued by the Tahasildar, Jatani.
4. Heard learned counsel for the Parties.
5. During course of hearing, learned counsel for the State, at the outset, submits that there is a clear statutory remedy of appeal available under the O.P.L.E Act against the impugned notice of eviction dated 29.11.2025. Hence, the Petitioner should approach the Appellate Authority.



6. In such view of the matter, this Court is not inclined to entertain the prayer made in this Writ Petition. However, considering the request of learned counsel for the Petitioner, this Court permits the Petitioner to file an appeal along with a petition for condonation of delay, if any, so also a petition for interim protection before the concerned Appellate Authority as per the provision under the O.P.L.E Act, within a period of fifteen working days hence. In such event, the Appellate Authority shall conclude the hearing after providing adequate opportunity of hearing to the parties concerned within a period of one month from the date of filing of the appeal.

7. It is further directed that till disposal of the appeal to be filed by the Petitioner, no coercive action shall be taken against the Petitioner pursuant to the impugned notice of eviction dated 29.11.2025.

8. This Writ Petition is, accordingly, disposed of.
