Order No. 01

1. This matter is taken up through hybrid mode.
2. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel appearing for the Opp. Parties.
3. Petitioner has filed the present writ petition inter alia with the following prayer:-

“In view of above facts and circumstances more fully narrated herein above, the petitioner most humbly prays that this Hon’ble Court may be graciously pleased to allow the writ application, issue Rule of NISI upon the Opposite Parties to show cause:-

A. *As to why the salary has not been disbursed to the petitioner*

B. *As to why the Opposite Parties No.5 and O.P-6 shall not be directed to release the salary of the petitioner.*

C. *And as to pass any order or orders, direction/ directions/ writ/writs as this Hon’ble Court may deem fit and proper.*



And on their failure to show cause or showing insufficient cause, this Hon'ble Court be pleased to make the said RULE absolute by way of issuance of appropriate writ or writs, order or orders in the facts and circumstances of the present case.

And for this act of Your Lordship's kindness, the petitioner shall ever pray."

4. However, taking into account the claim raised in the present Writ Petition, liberty is granted to the Petitioner to make a fresh representation before Opp. Party No.5 by enclosing all the relevant documents and citations in support of her claim, if any, within a period of three (3) weeks hence.

5. It is observed that if such representation is filed within the aforesaid time period, Opp. Party No.5 shall do well to take a lawful decision on the same within a period of three (3) months from the date of receipt of such representation. The order so passed by Opp. Party No.5 be communicated to the Petitioner.

6. With the aforesaid observation and direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.
