01. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid mode.
2. Considering the urgency of the matter that the Petitioner(s) apprehends his arrest and that the Courts are not functioning during the winter vacation, the matter is taken up directly without remanding the matter to the jurisdictional Sessions Court.
3. Heard learned counsel for the Petitioner and learned counsel for the State.
4. The present application has been filed under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023 by the Petitioner seeking pre-arrest bail in connection with Kanas P.S. Case No.247 of 2021, corresponding to G.R. Case No.3336 of 2021, pending in the court of learned J.M.F.C., Kanas.
5. It is stated by learned counsel for the Petitioner that the Petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case at the instance of the Informant. He further submitted that although the



Informant and the Petitioner belong to the same locality they had a previous enmity. It was also contended that the injuries sustained by the injured are simple in nature as per the medical examination report, a certified copy of which was produced in Court today. It was also contended that the Petitioner does not have any similar criminal antecedent.

6. Considering the nature of allegation, gravity of offence and the facts and circumstances of the case, I am not inclined to grant pre-arrest bail to the Petitioner. However, it is directed that in the event the Petitioner surrenders before the Court in seisin over the matter within a period of four weeks from today and moves an application for bail, the Court in seisin over the matter shall release him on bail in connection with the aforesaid case on such terms and conditions as it may deem just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case, but subject to verification of criminal antecedent of the Petitioner. In the event the Petitioner is having any similar criminal antecedent, then this order stands automatically revoked. Violation of any of the terms and conditions shall entail cancellation of bail.

7. Accordingly, the ABLAPL is disposed of.
