ORDER

01. 1. This matter is taken up through Hybrid Arrangement (Virtual /Physical Mode).
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Additional Standing counsel for the State-Opposite Parties. Perused the writ petition as well as documents annexed thereto.
3. The present writ petition has been filed by the petitioner with the following prayers:

“It is therefore, most humbly prayed that this Hon'ble Court be graciously pleased to:

i) Admit the writ application.

ii) Call for the record.

iii) Issue a writ in the nature of mandamus or any other writ/writ, order/orders, direction/directions by directing the opposite parties to regularize the service of the petitioner from 06.04.2002 till 07.09.2010 and to extend all the service and financial benefits including arrear salary by treating the date of initial appointment as 18.05.1996 in terms of the order dated 05.08.2022



passed in WPC (OAC) No. 2642/2011 under Annexure:10 within a reasonable time to be stipulated by this Hon'ble Court.

iv) And further the Opposite Parties be directed to extend the pension and other pensionary benefits as per the DCS (Pension) Rules, 1992 by treating the date of regular appointment as 18.05.1996.

v) And/or pass any other order/orders, direction/directions as this Hon'ble Court deems fit and proper for the ends of justice.”

4. In course of hearing, learned counsel for the Petitioner submits that the Petitioner may be granted liberty to file a fresh representation ventilating his grievance before the Block Education Officer, Salipur, Cuttack, Opposite Party No.4 which may be considered within a stipulated period of time in accordance with law.

5. Learned Additional Standing counsel on the other hand submits that she has no objection if liberty is granted to the Petitioner to file a fresh representation before the Opposite Party No.4 and the same is considered and disposed of in accordance with law.

6. In view of the aforesaid limited nature of grievance of the petitioner, this Court disposes of the writ petition granting liberty to the Petitioner to file a fresh representation before the Block Education Officer, Salipur, Cuttack, Opposite Party No.4 ventilating his grievance within a period of two weeks. If such a representation is filed within the time stipulated, the same shall be considered and disposed of by the Opposite Party No.4 keeping in view under Annexure-10 within a period of eight weeks from the date of filing representation by passing a



speaking and reasoned order. The decision so taken on the same shall be communicated to the Petitioner within ten days thereafter.

7. With the aforesaid observation/direction, the writ petition is disposed of.

Urgent certified copy of this order be granted on proper application.
