SURYA PARTAP SINGH, J. (Oral):

1. This is a petition for anticipatory bail, filed by the petitioner under Section 482 of 'the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023' in a case arising out of FIR No.248 dated 03.12.2025. The above mentioned FIR has been lodged for the commission of offence punishable under Sections 108, 3(5) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023, Police Station Chheharta, District Amritsar.
2. Vide order dated 09.02.2026, the petitioner was admitted to interim anticipatory bail, subject to the condition of furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer.
3. It has been submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that in compliance with above mentioned order dated 09.02.2026, the petitioner has already joined the investigation. The learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that in view of above, the order dated 09.02.2026 should be made absolute.



4. On the instructions of A.S.I. Harjinder Singh, the learned State Counsel has submitted that in compliance with the order dated 09.02.2026, the petitioner has joined the investigation on 16.02.2026, and that for further investigation of this case custodial interrogation of the petitioner is not required.

5. In view of above, the order dated 09.02.2026, whereby interim anticipatory bail was accorded to the petitioner, is hereby made absolute.

6. Present petition stands allowed, accordingly.
