NIDHI GUPTA J. (Oral)

Present contempt petition has been filed alleging violation of order dated 11.11.2025 (Annexure P-2) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-33355-2025 titled as “Sandeep Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and others”, whereby respondents No.1 to 3 therein were directed “...to pass a speaking order, after affording them an opportunity to be heard, within a period of 03 months from the date of receiving a certified copy of this order. Further, the decision taken thereof shall be conveyed to the petitioners. Needless to say, if the petitioners are found entitled to the relief sought, the same shall be granted forthwith by respondents No.1 to 3....”.



Mr. Arun Kumar Khurmi, Advocate has put in appearance and filed Power of Attorney on behalf of respondent No.3. The same is taken on record. He also filed reply dated 15.3.2026 by way of affidavit of Ms. Neeru Katyal Gupta, IAS, Commissioner Municipal Corporation, Ludhiana on behalf of respondent No.3, the same is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioners. Learned counsel for respondent No.3 submits that the Writ Court has been complied with and a Compliance Order dated 12.3.2026 has been passed by the respondent-authority after affording opportunity of hearing to the petitioners on 17.2.2026.

Copy of the aforesaid reply alongwith Compliance Order dated 12.3.2026 (Annexure R-1) produced by the learned counsel for the respondent No.3 is taken on record. Short reply dated 11.5.2026 by way of affidavit of Shri Manjit Singh Brar, Secretary to Govt. of Punjab on behalf of respondent No.1 has also been filed in the Court. the same is taken on record. Copies thereof are supplied to learned counsel for the petitioners. Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that since the Writ Court order dated 11.11.2025 (Annexure P-2) has been complied with while passing a Speaking Order dated 12.3.2026 by the respondent-authority, nothing survives in the present contempt petition and the same may be disposed of.



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In view of the above noted facts and the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioners, the present contempt petition is **disposed of**.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
