SHALINI SINGH NAGPAL J. (Oral)

1. Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case arising out of FIR No. 276 dated 20.11.2025 under Sections 108, 62 and 3(5) Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, Police Station Sadar Bathinda, District Bathinda. This is the first petition for anticipatory bail.

2. On 10.03.2026, following order was passed:

“Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case arising out of FIR No. 276 dated 20.11.2025 under Sections 108, 62 and 3(5) Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, Police Station Sadar Bathinda, District Bathinda. This is the first petition for anticipatory bail.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner was mother of Ajay, who was in relationship with Laxmi-complainant and allegations against the petitioner were that she, along with co-accused Paramjit Kaur etc. visited the house of the complainant on 16.11.2025 at 1.00 PM, quarrelled with her, threatened to harm her and not to



call Ajay, proclaiming that they would not let her get married with Ajay due to which complainant consumed poison. Learned counsel further submits that co-accused namely Paramjit Kaur against whom identical allegations were levelled, had since been enlarged on interim anticipatory bail by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court; that antecedents of the petitioner were clean, her custodial interrogation was not required and she was ready and willing to join investigation.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Kunwarbir Singh, AAG Punjab, who is present in the Court accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State, opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail and seeks some time to file the status report.

Status report in the matter be filed on 14.05.2026.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim anticipatory bail subject to her furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. Petitioner shall join investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.

To be read with CRM-M-9724-2026.”

3. Vide order dated 10.03.2026 passed by this Court, the petitioner was granted interim bail and was directed to join investigation.
4. Learned State counsel has filed status report by way of affidavit



of Harvinder Singh Sra, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Rural Bathinda and on instructions from HC Ramandeep Kagra submits that petitioner has joined investigation and is no longer required for custodial interrogation.

5. Petitioner has joined investigation pursuant to order of this Court dated 10.03.2026 and his further custodial interrogation is not required. In the circumstances of the case but without commenting on merits, the petition is allowed and order dated 10.03.2026, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 482(2) of Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023.

6. Pending CRM(s), if any, are also disposed of accordingly.
