JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondents to scan the biometrics/fingerprints of deaf and dumb unidentified child.
2. The petitioner is acting as caretaker of a child who was recovered at Ismailabad, Kurukshetra. He is deaf and dumb. The petitioner is attempting to ascertain identity of the said child. He believes that aforesaid child's identity can be ascertained from the office of Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI).
3. Learned Senior counsel for the respondents submits that petitioner may be directed to appear before Authorities along with aforesaid child and requisite documents. The competent authority will sympathetically and swiftly act upon.

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4. Learned counsel for the petitioner agrees to the aforesaid arrangement.

5. In the wake of statement of both sides, the petition stands disposed of with a direction to petitioner to appear along with aforesaid child and requisite documents before Aadhaar Enrolment Centre, State Bank of India, Ladwa, Kurukshetra on 11.05.2026 at 11:00 AM. The Authorities shall act swiftly & sympathetically and attempt to resolve the issue instead of lingering the same.
