1. This petition for anticipatory bail is the first petition filed by the petitioner under Section 482 of 'the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023'. It has been filed with regard to a case arising out of FIR No.127 dated 21.07.2025, for the commission of offence punishable under Section(s) 308(4), 125, 351(2), and 61(2) [Section 111 added later on] of 'the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023' and section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959, Police Station Ghuman, District Batala/Gurdaspur, Punjab.

2. Vide order dated 20.04.2026 the petitioner was admitted to interim anticipatory bail, subject to the condition of furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of arresting officer. It was also directed that the petitioner shall join the investigation.

3. The learned State Counsel has filed short reply in the Registry. The same be taken on record.

4. Heard.

5. It has been submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that in compliance with order dated 20.04.2026, the petitioner has already joined the investigation, and that nothing has been left to be recovered from the possession of petitioner. In view of above, the learned counsel for the petitioner has requested that the order dated 20.04.2026 be made absolute.

6. The learned State counsel, on the instructions of 'ASI Jagdish Singh', has submitted that the petitioner has joined investigation, and that for further investigation of this case his custodial interrogation is not required.

7. The record has been perused carefully.

8. Keeping in view the aforesaid submissions and the fact that the petitioner has already joined the investigation, it is hereby ordered that the petitioner is entitled for anticipatory bail. Hence, the present petition is hereby **allowed** and the order dated 20.04.2026, whereby the petitioner was accorded the benefit of interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute.
