SURYA PARTAP SINGH, J (ORAL)

This is a petition filed under Section 528 of 'the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023', seeking for quashing of order dated 29.07.2025 (Annexure P-13) passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate First Class Jalandhar, hereinafter being referred to as 'trial Court' only, whereby the petitioner has been declared a proclaimed person.

2. **Notice of motion.**

3. Since advance notice has already been served upon the State, Mr. Eklavya Darshi, Deputy Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent/State. Hence, service of notice upon the State is hereby dispensed with. However, no formal reply has been filed by the State and the learned State counsel has opted to orally oppose the present petition.



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4. It has been contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner has been prosecuted in a complaint case, filed by the respondent No.2, under Negotiable Instruments Act. As per learned counsel for the petitioner, in the abovementioned complaint, after summoning order any summon or warrant was never served upon him, and that he was not residing at the given address.

5. In view of the fact that the petitioner has never been served with any summons and he has not violated any condition of bail, it is hereby held that the offence for which he has been summoned, still remains bailable.

6. In view of above, the present petition is hereby ***disposed of*** with a direction to the petitioner to surrender before the learned trial Court within a period of one month from today. If the petitioner surrenders before the learned trial Court within the stipulated period and moves an application for bail, the learned trial Court shall admit the petitioner to bail on the same day.
