1. Present application is for placing on record the correct copy of Annexure P-3 i.e. order dated 17.05.2024 passed in CRM-191120-2024 in/and CRR-1924-2015, in the interest of justice.

2. In view of the averments made in the application, same is allowed as prayed for, subject to just exceptions.

Main Case

3. Prayer in the present petition is for initiation of proceedings under Sections 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 against the respondents for alleged willful disobedience of the directions issued by the Writ Court vide order dated 18.03.2025 (Annexure P-1), passed in CWP-21521-2023, whereby direction was issued to the appropriate authority to decide the claim moved by the petitioner within a period of three months.

4. Mr. Balwinder Singh, A.A.G. Punjab representing the respondents has submitted compliance report by way of affidavit dated 04.05.2026 of



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Paramvir Singh, General Manager, Punjab Roadways, Rupnagar on behalf of respondent No.3 and submits that the aforesaid order stands complied with. The compliance report is taken on record.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner confirms that payment with respect to leave encashment, GPF, death ex-gratia and family pension for one month has been released to the petitioner.

6. It is further informed by the learned State Counsel that the case regarding payment of gratuity been sent to the office of Accountant General (A&E), Punjab vide letter dated 23.05.2025 and by further communication letter dated 29.04.2026, additional required documents were supplied to the said office for approval of the gratuity and arrears of pension would also be released accordingly.

7. In view of above, learned State Counsel submits that since the order dated 18.03.2025 stands complied with, as such the present petition may be disposed of as having rendered infructuous.

8. Accordingly, the present petition is disposed of as having rendered infructuous; however, in case the petitioner does not receive the remaining financial benefits, the petitioner is at liberty to file application to seek revival of the present petition. The petitioner is further granted liberty to claim interest, if any, as per law.

9. Disposed of with the liberty aforesaid.

10. Pending miscellaneous applications, if any, shall stand disposed of.
