1. Prayer in this petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is for directing official respondents No.2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners and not to interfere in the peaceful life of the petitioners at the behest of respondent No.4 and other relatives.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners states that both the petitioners are major and have married against the wishes of respondent No.4 and other relatives and have sought protection to their life and liberty. They apprehend danger from respondent No.4 and other relatives. Their marriage certificate and photographs evidencing their marriage are on record as Annexures P-3 and P-4. Learned counsel for the petitioners states that petitioners have filed representation dated 21.04.2026 (Annexure P-5) before the Superintendent of Police, Yamuna Nagar, District Yamuna Nagar, Haryana, for the redressal of their claim and the same has not yet been decided.

3. Notice of motion to the official respondents.



4. On asking of the Court, Mr. Sumit Jain, Addl. AG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-State.

5. Without entering upon an exercise to evaluate the evidentiary value of the documents placed on the file, I dispose of the petition with a direction to respondent No.2-Superintendent of Police, Yamuna Nagar, District Yamuna Nagar, Haryana to decide the representation dated 21.04.2026 (Annexure P-5) of the petitioners and grant them protection, if any threat to their life and liberty is perceived. It is clarified that this order shall not be taken to grant immunity to the petitioners from legal action for violation of law, if any, committed by them. This order would not be understood having expressed any opinion whatsoever by this Court on the validity of the marriage of the petitioners.

6. Disposed of.
