1. The instant petition has been instituted invoking the jurisdiction of this Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, directing the respondents to regularize the services of the petitioner by claiming his legal right under the notification/policy framed by the Government of Haryana dated 18.06.2014 (Annexure P-2) and grant him regular pay scale alongwith all consequential benefits, including seniority, from the date his juniors were granted the same benefit.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner joined service as a part-time Water Carrier in the Employment Exchange, District Kaithal vide appointment letter dated 29.09.2003 (Annexure P-1), pursuant to which he submitted his joining report on 06.10.2003.



4. In the meantime, the Government of Haryana issued a policy/notification dated 18.06.2014 (Annexure P-2) for regularization of the services of Group C and Group D employees who had completed more than three years of continuous service as on 28.05.2014, subject to certain conditions, which are culled out hereunder:-

“(i) That the employee/worker should have worked for not less than 3(three) years as on 28th May May,2014and still in service.

(ii) That the employee/worker possessed the prescribed qualifications for the post on the date of appointment / engagement.

(iii) The post against which the regularization is be done should be a sanctioned vacant post at the time of initial appointment/engagement and also at the time of regularization.”

5. The specific case set up by the petitioner is that he has rendered service for more than 22 years from the date of his joining i.e. 06.10.2003, and that he was engaged through the proper channel after having been sponsored through the Employment Exchange, Kaithal. An appointment letter to this effect was issued on 29.09.2003 by the District Ayurvedic Officer, AYUSH Department. It is further contended that the petitioner fulfills the requisite qualifications for the post of Water Carrier/Group D employee and is also entitled to the benefit of the judgment rendered by this Court in CWP-31304-2025 titled *Joginder Singh vs. State of Haryana & Ors.*, decided on 31.12.2025.

6. Notice of motion.

7. Ms. Mayuri Lakhanpal Kalia, learned DAG, Haryana, having been served with an advance copy of the petition, has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State.

8. Learned State counsel submits that a Division Bench of this Court in LPA No. 1810-2025 titled *Aas Mohammad and Ors. vs. State of Haryana & Ors.*, along with other connected appeals, vide order dated 23.04.2026, on the assurance



given by the learned Advocate General, Haryana, disposed of the bunch of LPAs with a stipulation that the case of each and every individual in the said appeals would be considered afresh and fresh orders would be passed therein in view of the principles laid down in Madan Singh's case (supra).

9. It is further submitted that, on the same terms, the case of the present petitioner can also be considered and, if he is found fully eligible and covered under the policy dated 18.06.2014 (Annexure P-2), necessary orders regarding his regularization shall be passed.

10. In light of the above, without advertng to the merits of the case any further at this stage, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the present writ petition with a direction to respondent No.2, Director General, Department of AYUSH, or any other competent authority, to consider the case of the petitioner, in the light of the above observations and after considering the pleas raised in the petition, while treating the writ petition itself as a comprehensive representation made by the petitioner, pass a speaking order within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. A copy of the order so passed shall be conveyed to the petitioner within one week thereafter.

11. Accordingly, the present petition stands disposed of.
