H.S. GREWAL, J (Oral):

Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for quashing of FIR No.21, dated 01.03.2025, under Sections 27-29-61-85 of NDPS Act, registered at Police Station Chamkaur Sahib, District Rupnagar (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

2. The case of the prosecution is that a secret information was received wherein it was informed that the petitioner was habitual of selling *Chitta* (Heroin) and consuming it and he had kept some in his shop as well. On the said information, the shop was raided and the petitioner immediately swallowed the contraband in his possession, later he was made to vomit and the same turned out to be tramadol.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the FIR was registered on the basis of secret information. No intoxicant substance has been recovered from the petitioner and his shop. There is no evidence collected by



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investigating agency to connect the present petitioner with the alleged crime. Prayer is made for allowing the petition for quashing of the aforesaid FIR and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

4. Status report by way of affidavit of Manjit Singth Aulakh, PPS, DSP, Sri Chamkaur Sahib, District Rupnagar has been filed on behalf of respondent-State wherein it is stated that from the ocular version of the eye-witnesses and Dope Test Report (Annexure R.1), it has been established that the petitioner-Sukhwinder Singh @ Laddi had consumed the intoxicants in front of the police officials kept by him in his shop for selling to drug addicts, therefore a case under Section 27,29 of NDPS Act is made out against him.

5. Learned State counsel submits that the Dope Test of petitioner was found positive with Benzodiazepines, Oxycodone, Tramadol and Opiates (Morphine, Codine, Heroin) as per report dated 02.03.2025. That apart, he is also involved in three more cases of NDPS Act.

6. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record with their able assistance.

7. As per status report, the petitioner had consumed the intoxicants in front of the Police Officials, kept by him in his shop for selling purpose. The present petitioner is involved in three more cases under the NDPS Act. Therefore, this Court does not find it a fit case to quash the FIR in question. Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.

8. Pending application, if any, shall stand disposed of accordingly.
