RAMESH CHANDER DIMRI, J. (ORAL)

1. Allegations against the petitioner in the FIR in question are that he and his wife were accused in a case bearing FIR No.108 dated 14.05.2023 under Sections 448/511 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Haibowal, District Ludhiana; that while obtaining bail in the said FIR, they produced a surety named Uttam Singh son of Arjan Singh; that the said Uttam Singh produced document of property while furnishing surety in favour of the petitioner etc. which was not valid; that the property mentioned in such document had already been sold by the said Uttam Singh; that therefore, on the date of presentation of the said document as surety, the same was a false document; that the petitioner knew about the said fact but even then produced



the said Uttam Singh as surety in the said case; that the said production was done by the petitioner etc. in criminal conspiracy with each other; and that since said document was used as a genuine document, the petitioner etc. have committed the offences mentioned in the FIR Ex.P3. If the said allegations are taken at face value thereof, the same, *prima facie*, make out offences mentioned in the said FIR. Factual disputes cannot be gone into at the time of deciding a petition under Section 528 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (for brevity, 'BNSS, 2023'). Present matter does not at all appear to be a case involving abuse of process of Court. Ends of justice also require that investigation of the FIR in question should be taken to its logical end.

2. In view thereof, there is no ground to exercise inherent powers of this Court under Section 528 of BNSS, 2023 as such powers have always to be used sparingly and in exceptional circumstances.

3. Petition is accordingly dismissed. All interim application/s, if any, stand disposed off.
