Vide order dated 24.04.2026, on the request made by learned counsel for the parties, the matter was referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court for exploring the possibility of an amicable settlement between the parties.

A report dated 12.03.2026 has been received from the learned Mediator, wherein it has been recorded that the parties have amicably resolved their inter se dispute and have entered into a Settlement Agreement dated 12.03.2026. The said Settlement Agreement forms part of the report submitted by the Mediation and Conciliation Centre.

Learned counsel for the appellant submits that in view of the settlement so arrived at between the parties before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, the present appeal has been rendered



infructuous and prays that the same be disposed of in terms of the aforesaid Settlement Agreement.

This Court has considered the submissions made by learned counsel for the parties and perused the report of the learned Mediator along with the Settlement Agreement dated 12.03.2026. It is evident therefrom that the parties have voluntarily and amicably settled their disputes without any coercion or undue influence.

In view of the settlement arrived at between the parties, this Court is satisfied that no dispute survives for adjudication in the present appeal.

Accordingly, the Settlement Agreement dated 12.03.2026 is taken on record and the same shall form part of this order.

The present appeal is disposed of in terms of the aforesaid Settlement Agreement.

Needless to observe, the parties shall remain bound by the terms and conditions of the Settlement Agreement and shall abide by the same in letter as well as in spirit.

Pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of.
