AMAN CHAUDHARY, J. (ORAL)

1. These cases are disposed of by this common order as they arise out of the same FIR.
2. The present petitions have been filed under Section 482 BNSS for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.61 dated 24.05.2025, registered under Sections 420, 120-B IPC, at Police Station Division-C, District Police Commissionerate, Amritsar.
3. On 11.03.2026, this Court had passed the following order:-

“Learned counsel submits that the dispute in the case is civil in nature in respect of agreement to sell dated 21.06.2023, however, instead of filing any suit, the present FIR has been registered. He is ready and willing to join the investigation as and when required by the investigating agency and will cooperate.

Adjourned to 24.03.2026.

Meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation on or before 17.03.2026. In the event of his arrest, he shall be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer, subject to compliance of conditions as enshrined under Section 482(2) BNSS.

However, it is clarified that if the petitioner does not



join and cooperate with the Investigating Agency as required by the Arresting/Investigating Officer, this interim order shall be deemed to have been vacated.

Photocopy of this order be placed on the connected file(s).”

4. Learned counsel submits that in pursuance of the afore-mentioned order, the petitioners have not only joined investigation but also fully cooperated with the investigating agency. He further submits that in case the investigating agency requires the petitioners to appear, they shall make themselves available without demur.

5. Learned State counsel on instructions affirms the factum of joining the investigation by the petitioners on 17.03.2026 and cooperating with the investigating agency. He also submits that at this stage, the petitioners are not required for further custodial interrogation.

6. In view of the above and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, anticipatory bail petitions filed by the petitioners are allowed and the order dated 11.03.2026 granting interim bail them him, is hereby made absolute, subject to compliance of conditions as specified under Section 482(2) BNSS.

7. However, it is made clear that if the petitioners fail to join and cooperate with the investigating agency as and when required, the State would be at liberty to move an application for cancellation of the present anticipatory bail granted to them.
