N.S. SHEKHAWAT, J. (ORAL)

1. After arguing at length, when this Court is not inclined to grant any relief, learned counsel for the petitioner wishes to withdraw the present petition with liberty to raise all the pleas available to him before the trial Court at an appropriate stage.
2. Dismissed as withdrawn with the liberty as aforementioned.
3. In case, the petitioner moves an application seeking exemption from personal appearance during the course of trial, the trial Court shall consider the same sympathetically, in view of the fact that she is a lady. While granting the exemption from personal appearance, the trial Court will be at liberty to impose any condition, as may be deemed fit and appropriate and the trial Court is also at liberty to ensure the presence of the petitioner on any date of hearing.



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4. It is further clarified that the trial Court shall decide the trial on the basis of the evidence led by both the parties, during the course of trial, which includes the medical evidence, without getting influenced of the present order.

5. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, stand(s) disposed of accordingly.
