Prayer

1. The jurisdiction of this Court has been invoked under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing the impugned charge-sheet dated 06.06.2013 (Annexure P-7), impugned enquiry report dated 09.08.2016 (Annexure P-14), impugned speaking order dated 18.11.2024 (Annexure P-28) and impugned dismissal order dated 09.09.2020 (Annexure P-29).

Factual Backdrop

2. The petitioner was appointed as a Medical Officer on 14.06.2002, was deputed to the World Health Organization from 18.10.2004 to 16.08.2011 and



thereafter joined Jhpiego on deputation after duly informing the competent authority. Following the Government's decision dated 23.02.2012 declining extension of his deputation, the petitioner, vide representation dated 03.05.2012, requested for a posting but was instead issued a charge sheet on 06.06.2013. Although he submitted his reply, he was held guilty in an enquiry report dated 09.08.2016, purportedly in breach of the applicable rules, and his objections remained unaddressed. Owing to continued inaction, the petitioner approached this Court by way of CWP No. 16853 of 2024, which was disposed of with a direction to consider his representation; however, only after a subsequent contempt proceedings, the respondents rejected his claim through a speaking order dated 18.11.2024 and furnished the dismissal order dated 09.09.2020.

3. Today, learned State counsel submits that, subject to the following conditions, the respondents would have no objection to the petitioner rejoining service in the Health Department. The conditions are as hereunder:

- “1. I have no objection if that the intervening period be considered as non duty period for all purposes.*
- 2. I will not claim any financial benefit for the intervening period in which I remained out of service.*
- 3. I will not file any court case regarding benefit of this intervening period.*
- 4. That no FIR, Court case or criminal case is pending against me in the intervening period.*

4. In response to the aforesaid proposal, learned Senior counsel for the petitioner, assisted by the petitioner in person, submits that the petitioner shall submit an affidavit affirming the above conditions positively by tomorrow, i.e., 25.03.2026, at 10:00 AM in the office of the Director General, Health Services,



Haryana. It is directed that upon submission of such affidavit, the petitioner shall be permitted to rejoin service, subject to the aforesaid conditions.

5. It is, however, clarified that the issue of seniority is left open. In case the petitioner submits a representation claiming seniority, the same shall be considered and decided in accordance with law within a period of one month from the date of such representation.

6. In view of the above, learned Senior counsel for the petitioner seeks permission to withdraw the present petition.

7. Prayer is accepted.

8. Dismissed as withdrawn.

9. Pending application(s), if any shall be disposed off.
