JASJIT SINGH BEDI, J. (ORAL)

The prayer in this petition is for quashing of an GDR bearing No.31 dated 06.04.2025 registered under Sections 118(2), 118(1), 324(4), 351(2)(3), 191(3), 190 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, registered in FIR bearing No.45 dated 04.04.2025 under Sections 115, 118(1), 190, 191(3) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, both at Police Station Khalra, Tarn Taran, along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of a compromise arrived at between the parties.

Vide order dated 06.11.2025 this Court had directed the parties to appear before Illaqa Magistrate for getting their statements recorded with regard to the compromise dated 03.10.2025 (P-2).



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The Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court was to submit a report in this regard giving certain details as enumerated in the said order.

Pursuant to the order dated 06.11.2025 passed by this Court, the parties have appeared before the learned Civil Judge (Jr. Division)-cum-Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Patti and as per the report dated 02.01.2026 submitted to this Court, both the parties have got recorded their respective statements in Court.

A perusal of the aforesaid report would show that the parties have effected a genuine compromise without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence. In view of the compromise there is a remote possibility of the complainant coming forward to support the prosecution case. The powers under Section 482 Cr.PC can be exercised in such like situation in order to prevent unnecessary vagaries of criminal trial to be faced by the parties, when there are remote chances of conviction of the accused. The compromise in question is found to be fully in consonance with the direction issued by the Court in “***Kulwinder Singh & Ors. Vs. State of Punjab 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab & Anr., 2012(4) RCR (CrL) 543***”.

In view of the aforesaid report of the learned Civil Judge (Jr. Division)-cum-Judicial Magistrate, 1st Class, Patti accompanied by statements of both the parties, the GDR bearing No.31 dated 06.04.2025 registered under Sections 118(2), 118(1), 324(4), 351(2)(3), 191(3), 190 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, registered in FIR bearing No.45 dated 04.04.2025 under Sections 115, 118(1), 190, 191(3) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, both at Police Station Khalra, Tarn Taran



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along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby
quashed qua the petitioners.

Petition stands disposed of.
