1. The present petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.0153 dated 04.09.2025, under Sections 85, 316(2) of BNS, 2023, registered at Police Station City Malout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib.

2. Vide order dated 12.12.2025, this Court while granting the concession of interim anticipatory bail directed the petitioner to join investigation.

3. Vide subsequent order dated 04.02.2026, the parties were relegated to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court.

4. As per the report received from the Mediator, the mediation has failed, as the petitioner wishes to reconcile and restore the matrimonial relationship, whereas the complainant intends to part ways.



5. In view of the above, the parties are at liberty to avail their appropriate remedies in accordance with law.
6. At this stage, learned State counsel submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is no longer required.
7. Accordingly, the present petition is allowed. The order dated 12.12.2025 granting interim anticipatory bail to the petitioner, is made absolute. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so by the Investigating Agency and shall abide by the conditions of Section 482 BNSS.
8. However, nothing stated above shall be construed as a final expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
9. It is made clear that, in case, the petitioner is found involved in any such activity once again, the present concession granted shall automatically stand vacated.
10. However, it is made clear that this order shall not be construed as parity qua any other co-accused.
11. Pending application(s), if any, stands disposed of.
