1. The petitioner has filed this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.403/2023 registered at Police Station Sadar Nimbahera, District Chittorgarh for offence under Sections 8/15, 29 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per the prosecution story, 1743 Kg 100 gm Poppy Straw has been recovered from the co-accused Bheru Lal and Unkar Lal. He again submits that on the basis of the disclosure statements of the above co-accused, co-accused Sanjay has been arrested and thereafter, on his narration, the other co-accused Surpal was arrested and on the basis of the disclosure statement of Surpal, the present petitioner has been impleaded. He again submitted that the co-accused Sanjay and Surpal have been given the

benefit of bail on 09.10.2025 & 25.07.2025, respectively. The petitioner is behind the bars since 06.12.2025 with two criminal cases registered of similar nature being registered against him, but in all those cases he has already been bailed out and charge-sheet has been filed. The trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required. Hence, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed on the ground of parity.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, especially on the ground of parity, but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Jasraj Alias Jassu S/o Peera Ram Jat**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
