1. The petitioner has preferred this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.166/2025 registered at Police Station Kolayat, District Bikaner for offence under Sections 115(2), 126(2), 109(2), 324(5), 3(5) BNS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that allegations against the present petitioner is of inflicting injury to injured Karni Singh. He argued that there was no specific injury on vital part of the body of the injured and as per the injury report, only two injuries were inflicted on left and right forearm of the injured, which are not attributed as dangerous to life. Learned counsel further contended that the petitioner is behind the bars

since 30.12.2025, without any criminal past and charge-sheet has been filed. The trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required, hence the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Jalam Singh S/o Vishal Singh**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bail bond in the sum of Rs. 50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs. 25,000/- each of the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
