1. The petitioner has filed this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.37/2025 registered at Police Station Samdari, District Balotra for offence under Sections 8/15, 29 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that from the conscious possession of co-accused Jagdish and Vishnu, 39.680 Kg. Poppy-straw has been recovered which is below commercial quantity. The above co-accused have been enlarged on bail by a Coordinate Bench of this Court on 24.03.2025. The allegation against the petitioner is that he has purchased the above contraband from the co-accused. He again submits that the petitioner is behind the bars since 05.03.2025 with one criminal

antecedent but he is on bail in that case. The trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required, hence the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Sohan Lal S/o Shri Virdha Ram**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
