1. The petitioner have filed this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.02/2026 registered at Police Station CBN Javra for offence under Sections 8/18, 29 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case. He further

submits that 2.497 gram Opium which is below the commercial quantity alleged to have been recovered from the conscious possession of both petitioners. He again submits that the petitioners are behind the bars since 12.01.2026 without any criminal past. The trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required, hence the bail application of the petitioners may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioners but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioners.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Mohammed Sher S/o Mushtaq Khan and Nanalal S/o Bheru Lal Mali**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
