1. The present bail application has been filed by the accused-applicant under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S, 2023 against the order dated 14.01.2026 passed by learned Special Judge, POCSO Act 2012, No.1, Bhilwara in connection with FIR No.479/2024, registered at Police Station Mandal, District Bhilwara for the offences punishable under Sections 137(2), 127(2), 65(1), 70(2) of the BNS, Section 3/4, 5(G)(L)/6 of the POCSO Act, 2012 and Sections 3(1)(W)(II), 3(2)(V) of the SC/ST Act, by which the bail application of the accused-applicant under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S, 2023 has been dismissed.
2. Learned counsel for the accused-applicant submits that the accused-applicant has falsely been implicated in this matter.

Learned counsel argues that the charge-sheet against four persons including the present accused, has been filed. During the trial, the prosecutrix and her mother have been examined as PW-1 and PW-4, respectively and they have turned hostile to the extent of present accused. Learned counsel also argues that the accused-applicant was arrested on 27.01.2025 and since then, he is behind the bars. Learned counsel prays that trial will take long time to conclude, therefore, the accused-applicant be enlarged on bail.

3. On the other hand, learned Public Prosecutor vehemently oppose the bail application. Learned counsel for the complainant submits that, as the present accused has not been named in the court statement, the complainant has no objection if accused Rameshwar Lal be enlarged on bail.

4. Heard learned counsel for the parties and also perused the material available on record.

5. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the facts that the prosecutrix and her mother have turned hostile to the extent of present accused; that the accused-applicant is behind the bars since 27.01.2025; that the charge-sheet has been filed and trial will take long time to conclude, without expressing any opinion on the merits/demerits of the case, this Court deems it proper to allow the bail application filed by the accused-applicant.

6. Consequently, this bail application filed under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S, 2023 is allowed. It is ordered that accused-applicant **Rameshwar Lal Alias Ramesh S/o Bhairu Lal**, arrested in FIR No.479/2024, registered at Police Station Mandal, District Bhilwara shall be released on bail; provided he furnishes personal bond in

the sum of Rs.**50,000/-** and two solvent sureties of Rs.**25,000/-** each to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court.

7. The Accused-Applicant shall be required to appear before that Court on all dates of hearing and as and when called upon to do so.
