1. The present bail application has been filed by the accused-applicant under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S, 2023 against the order dated 31.01.2026 passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Balesar in connection with FIR No.104/2025, registered at Police Station Shergarh, District Jodhpur for the offences punishable under Sections 85, 80(2) and 108 of BNS, by which the bail application of the accused-applicant under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S, 2023 has been dismissed.

2. Learned counsel for the accused-applicant submits that the accused-applicant has falsely been implicated in this matter. Learned counsel argues that the allegation levelled against the accused-applicants are for the offences punishable under Sections 85, 80(2) and 108 of BNS. It is submitted that during trial, statements of important witnesses viz. Complainant, brother of the deceased, father of the deceased and mother of the deceased

have been recorded as PW1 to PW-4 respectively including the statements of witnesses have also been recorded as PW-5 to PW-10. The complainant, brother of the deceased, parents of the deceased as well as PW-5 to PW-10 have turned hostile and have not supported the prosecution story. It is further submitted, that during trial, they have stated in their court statements that the deceased was suffering from the mental illness, for which she was being treated was and also suffering from poor medical condition. Learned counsel also argues that the accused-applicant was arrested on 18.04.2025 and since then, he is behind the bars. Learned counsel prays that trial will take long time to conclude, therefore, the accused-applicant be enlarged on bail.

3. On the other hand, learned Public Prosecutor opposes the bail application.

4. Heard learned counsel for the parties and also perused the material available on record.

5. Having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case and considering the facts that the important witnesses have turned hostile during trial and the accused-applicant is behind the bars since 18.04.2025; that the charge-sheet has been filed and trial will take long time to conclude, but without expressing any opinion on the merits/demerits of the case, this Court deems it proper to allow the bail application filed by the accused-applicant.

6. Consequently, this bail application filed under Section 483 of the B.N.S.S, 2023 is allowed. It is ordered that accused-applicant **Narpatram S/o Bhanwararam**, arrested in FIR No.104/2025, registered at Police Station Shergarh, District Jodhpur shall be released on bail; provided he furnishes personal bond in the sum

of Rs.**50,000/-** and two solvent sureties of Rs.**25,000/-** each to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court.

7. The Accused-Applicant shall be required to appear before that Court on all dates of hearing and as and when called upon to do so.
