1. The petitioner has preferred this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.11/2026 registered at Police Station Mavli, District Udaipur for offence under Sections 8/22 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that 10 grams of MD has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. His further contention is that from the vehicle following the petitioner, 25 grams of MD, thus, total 35 grams have been recovered in the present matter, which is below commercial quantity. The petitioner is behind the bars since 24.01.2026, without any criminal past. The trial of the case will take considerable time, no fruitful purpose would be served by

keeping the petitioner in further custody, hence, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Vikas S/o Logar**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
