1. The petitioner has preferred this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.145/2025 registered at Police Station Talwada, District Hanumangarh for offence under Sections 8/21 and 25 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that as per prosecution story 100.51 grams of Heroin, which is below commercial quantity, has been allegedly recovered from co-accused Amrik Singh. It is argued that the said co-accused Amrik Singh has been granted benefit of bail by Co-ordinate Bench of this Court on 04.09.2025. Case of the present petitioner is that he

is the supplier of contraband to co-accused Amrik Sigh. Though, one case is reported to be pending against the petitioner, but he is on bail. The petitioner is behind the bars since 19.08.2025, charge-sheet has been filed and the trial of the case will take considerable time, therefore, no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in further custody and the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, especially on the ground of parity, but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Arshdeep Singh @ Gauri @ Ashu S/o Shri Sukhjeet Singh**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
