1. By way of filing the present writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, the petitioner has prayed for the following reliefs:-

"It is, therefore, prayed that Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to accept this writ petition by an appropriate order or direction in the nature thereof:-

i) The action of the respondents keeping the allotment of land in abeyance be quashed and set aside, and/or

ii) The respondents may kindly be directed to make allotment of land in pursuance of order dated 12.02.2002 & 27.12.2022; and/or (Anner. 3 &4)

iii) In alternate, the respondents may kindly be directed to allot alternative land to petitioner as per law; and/or

iv) The respondents may kindly be directed to positively decide on execution of the orders of appellate authority in time bound manner; and/or

v) Any order adverse to the petitioner if passed in the intervening period may also be declared bad in law and the same be also quashed and set aside; and/or

vi) Any other order or direction which may be found just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case be passed in favour of the Petitioner."

2. Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and having perused the material available on record, this court *prima facie* finds that the process for the allotment of agricultural land in Murabba No. 71/2025 of Chak 5 BWN, Mohangarh to the petitioner has not yet been concluded by the respondents without any reason or justification.

3. In that view of the matter, this court deems it just and proper to dispose of the present writ petition with liberty to the petitioner to file a fresh representation along with a certified copy of the instant order within a period of two weeks from today in the office of respondent No. 2, 3 and 4 seeking allotment of agricultural land situated in Murabba No. 71/2025 of Chak 5 BWN, Mohangarh, in his favour.

4. In case, a representation is so made, the respondent No. 2, 3 and 4 shall consider and decide the same in accordance with law as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of 12 weeks from receipt thereof.

5. It is made clear that the aforesaid direction to decide the representation has been issued only with a view to ensure expeditious redressal of petitioner's grievances and the same may not be constituted to be an order to decide a representation in a particular manner.

6. With the aforesaid direction, the present writ petition as well as stay petition(s) stand disposed of.
