1. The petitioners have preferred these bail applications under
Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.19/2026 registered at Police

Station Jaitsar, District Sri Ganganagar for offence under Sections 8/21, 25 and 29 of NDPS Act.

2. Since all these bail applications arise out of common FIR, therefore, they are being decided by this common order.

3. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that from the joint possession of petitioners, the alleged contraband 22.91 grams of Heroin (*chitta*) has been recovered, which is below commercial quantity. Learned counsel further contends that the petitioners have been behind bars since 05.02.2026. Though one case each against petitioner Sandeep Kumar and Karmjeet Singh is reported, but they are on bail in those cases, and petitioner Sarvajeet Singh has no criminal antecedents. The trial of the case may take considerable time, and no further custodial interrogation is required; hence, the bail applications of the petitioners may be allowed.

5. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail applications.

6. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioners but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bails to the petitioners.

7. Consequently, the bail applications under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioners **Karmjeet Singh S/o Manjeet Singh, Sarvajeet Singh S/o**

Parvindra Singh, Sandeep Kumar S/o Mahendra Singh, be released on bail provided each of them furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that they shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
