1. The petitioner has preferred this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.33/2026 registered at Police Station Balotara, District Balotara for offence under Sections 8/15, 25 of NDPS Act, Section 19/54 of Excise Act and Section 111(2) (A) of BNS.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. He further submits that 20.140 Kg Poppy straw (*Doda Post*), which is below the commercial quantity, has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. The petitioner is behind the bars since 13.02.2026. Though, one case of different nature is reported against the petitioner, but in that case he is bailed out. The trial of

the case will take considerable time, no fruitful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in further custody, hence, the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner, but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Hanuman Ram @ Harish S/o Shri Mangla Ram**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
