1. The present misc. application has been filed on behalf of the applicant seeking extension of period of emergent parole granted by this Court vide order dated 05.02.2026 in D.B. Criminal Writ Petition No.377/2026.

2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant was operated upon for piles and after the operation of piles, the applicant was advised rest. Learned counsel further submits that since the festival of Holi is approaching in a few days, therefore, the period of emergent parole granted by this Court may be extended for a period of 10 days while allowing the present misc. application.

3. We have considered the submissions made at the Bar and gone through the relevant record of the case.

4. It is true that the emergent parole was granted by this Court keeping in mind the fact that the applicant is suffering from the problems of piles and, therefore, he can be operated upon from the higher centre. In the present case, the applicant has already been operated for piles, and now, the learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been suggested to take rest and there is ensuing Holi Festival also.

5. In the considered opinion of this Court, this is misuse of leniency granted by this Court. Since the purpose for which the emergent parole was granted has been achieved, we see no reason for extension of the period of emergent parole granted by this Court on 05.02.2026.

6. Thus, the present misc. application has no force and the same is hereby dismissed.
