**Order**

1. The petitioner has filed this bail application under Section 483 of BNSS in FIR No.227/2022 registered at Police Station Raipur, District Pali for offence under Sections 8/18, 29 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned Public Prosecutor and perused the material available on record.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the allegation levelled against the petitioner is that he supplied the recovered contraband weighing 500 grams of opium milk, which is below the commercial quantity, to the prime accused, Ramesh Chand Kumawat, from whose conscious possession the same has been recovered. The co-accused Ramesh Chand Kumawat has been granted benefit of bail on 27.06.2022. He again submits that the petitioner is behind the bars since 16.02.2026. Though two criminal antecedents of a similar nature have been registered

against the present petitioner, but he has already been enlarged on bail in both the said cases. The trial of the case may take considerable time and no further custodial interrogation is required, hence the bail application of the petitioner may be allowed.

4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

5. On consideration of the rival submissions and material available on record and in the light of submission made by learned counsel for the petitioner but without expressing any opinion on merits/demerits of the case, I am inclined to grant benefit of bail to the petitioner.

6. Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 B.N.S.S. is allowed and it is directed that the petitioner **Lehru Lal S/o Bheru Lal**, be released on bail provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court on all subsequent dates of hearing till conclusion of the trial.
