1. The present writ petition has been preferred by the petitioners being aggrieved of the continued seizure of their land and the inaction on the part of the Revenue Appellate Authority in deciding the pending appeal along with the stay application.
2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and perused the material available on record.
3. It is not in dispute that against the order dated 19.01.2026, the petitioners have already preferred an appeal bearing

No.18/2026 before the Revenue Appellate Authority, Sriganganagar, along with a stay application, which are stated to be pending consideration.

4. This Court is of the view that once a statutory remedy of appeal along with a stay application is already availed and is pending consideration before the competent authority, the petitioners ought not to have invoked the extraordinary jurisdiction of this Court under Article 227 of the Constitution of India.

5. However, considering the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case and the predicament pointed out, particularly that the petitioners' rights relating to property and livelihood are stated to be affected, this Court deems it appropriate to dispose of the present writ petition with a direction to the Revenue Appellate Authority, Sriganganagar, to decide the pending appeal No.18/2026 as well as the stay application, expeditiously. It is expected that the Revenue Appellate Authority shall pass appropriate orders strictly in accordance with law, after affording an opportunity of hearing to the parties.

6. The writ petition is disposed of, accordingly.

7. No order as to costs.
