The present second bail application under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.35/2026 registered at Police Station Balotra, District Balotra for offences under Sections 331(4), 305(1), 112(2) and 3(5) of BNS, 2023.

Earlier first bail application was dismissed by this Court vide order dated 05.05.2026 passed in S.B. Criminal Misc. Bail Application No.5601/2026, however, liberty was granted to file fresh bail application after filing of the *challan*. Now *challan* has already been filed in this matter.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case. He further submits that the co-accused Sanjay Kumar @ Sanju has already been

enlarged on bail by this Court vide order dated 05.05.2026 in S.B. Criminal Misc. Bail Application No.5599/2026. It is also submitted that the petitioner is in judicial custody since 23.02.2026. The investigation qua the petitioner stands complete and the trial of the case will take sufficiently long time, therefore, the accused-petitioner may be enlarged on bail.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the second bail application.

Heard learned counsel for the parties perused the material available on record.

This Court has considered the rival submissions and perused the material available on record. Although there are number of cases pending against the petitioner, nevertheless, in none of the case, the petitioner has been convicted and in fact, he has been acquitted in five cases. Further, the investigation has been completed, no recovery is required to be made from the petitioner, continued incarceration of the petitioner is not warranted. The accused-petitioner is in judicial custody since 23.02.2026 and conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time. Further, the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner absconding or tampering with the evidence if released on bail. Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this Court deems it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the second bail application under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Indraj S/o Dharam Pal** arrested in connection with FIR No.35/2026 registered at Police Station Balotra, District

Balotra, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
