1. The present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the applicant-accused Ashok Kumar S/o Satyavan seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR No.52/2026 dated 13.03.2026 registered at P.S. Bhirani, District- Hanumangarh, for the offence under Sections 109(1), 125(b), 351(2) & 61(2) of BNS and Section 27 of Arms Act.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against him is complete and he is no more required in investigation. He further submits that there are no chance of fleeing of applicant accused from the jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. He also submits that the

applicant undertakes not to repeat offence and cooperate with investigation/trial, which will take time.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that this Hon'ble Court granted bail to co-accused Somveer @ Lala and Ramesh Kumar on 11.05.2026, and the same has been reflected in the impugned order dated 20.05.2026 passed by the trial Court. He also submitted that, except for the criminal cases registered against the petitioner, no other material has been brought on record by the Investigating Officer. He further referred to the role and involvement of the petitioner and submitted that, without ascertaining the role of the petitioner, a charge-sheet has been filed, and the same has been placed on record.
4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature.
5. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner-accused and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. On the basis of the report dated 13.03.2026 regarding the incident that occurred on the night of 12.03.2026, FIR No. 52/2026 was registered at P.S. Bhirani, District Hanumangarh. After investigation, the police has already filed a charge-sheet against Ashok Kumar, Sajjan @ Kala, Somveer @ Lala and Ramesh Kumar for offences under Sections 109(1), 125(b), 351(2), 61(2), 27 and 111(2)(b) of the BNS and Section 27 of the Arms Act, but the investigation has been kept pending under Section 193(9) of

the BNS against the remaining accused. This Court has already granted bail to Somveer @ Lala and Ramesh Kumar on 11.05.2026. The case of the present petitioner is similar to that of Somveer @ Lala and Ramesh Kumar, except for the fact that, as per the report, there are seven criminal antecedents against the petitioner. Therefore, it is appropriate to release the petitioner on bail, subject to certain stringent conditions.

7. Upon hearing the arguments and perusing the record, we have found that the applicant-accused is no more required in the investigation and he is in custody for quite some time. The further proceedings will take its own time, therefore, looking to entirety of facts and circumstances of the case and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, the Court deems it appropriate to grant bail to the applicant-accused.
8. Thus, the instant bail application filed on behalf of applicant-accused **Ashok Kumar S/o Satyavan**, is hereby allowed and the applicant-accused is ordered to be released on bail upon furnishing a personal bond of ₹50,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Trial Court with the following conditions:-
 - (i) The applicant-accused shall not tamper with evidence or influence the witness in any manner.
 - (ii) The applicant-accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not repeat any criminal offence punishable under the Law.

(iii) The applicant-accused shall attend the hearing of the Trial Court on the date fixed by the Trial court or as and when asked to appear before the Trial Court.

(iv) The petitioner shall mark his attendance at Police Station Bhirani, District Hanumangarh, on the second and fourth Wednesday of every month till the disposal of the criminal case by the trial Court.

(v) In case of any violation of above conditions, the bail granted to the applicant-accused shall be liable to be canceled.

9. The Registry is directed to send a copy of this order to the Trial Court through E-mail.
