The present criminal misc. petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 528 of BNSS for quashing of FIR No.370/2022 registered at Police Station Hanumangarh Town,

District Hanumangarh for offences under Sections 420, 406, 379 and 120-B of IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that there are chances of settlement through mediation.

The matter is hereby referred to the Mediation Centre attached to this Hon'ble Court.

The details of respondent No.2, including the contact number, shall be provided by counsel for the petitioner before the Mediation Centre within a period of two days. Upon receipt of the same, the Registry shall issue notice to respondent No.2 and call upon her to appear in the mediation proceedings.

The parties shall appear before the learned Mediator on 28.07.2026.

List this matter soon after culmination of the mediation proceedings.

Interim order, if any, shall continue till the next date of hearing.

However, it is made clear that this order of protection is only passed in order to make the mediation fruitful and if the mediation fails, the Court shall consider granting/extension of the interim order on merits.
