1. The present bail application under Section 483 of BNSS is filed by the applicant-accused **Ramniwas S/o Imarta Ram** seeking bail in respect of a criminal case registered as FIR No.53/2026 dated 29.03.2026 registered at Police Station Gogamedi, District Hanumangarh for the offence under Sections 310(4), 310(5) and 111(3) of BNS, 2023 and Sections 3/4 and 25 of Arms Act.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant submitted that the applicant has been falsely implicated in the matter and the investigation against him is complete and he is no more required in investigation. He further submitted that there are no chance of fleeing of applicant accused from the jurisdiction of this Hon'ble Court. He also submitted that the applicant undertakes not to repeat offence and cooperate with investigation/trial, which will take time.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant submits that several co-accused were granted bail by this Court vide a joint order dated 22.05.2026 and the case of present applicant-accused is in parity with those who were enlarged on bail by this Court.
4. Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that the allegations are grave and serious in nature.
5. Heard learned counsel for the applicant-accused and learned Public Prosecutor. Perused the material placed on record by both the parties.
6. On 22.05.2026 this Court has allowed bail application of Ashok, Jasvindra, Ajay and Rahul under Section 483 of BNSS after considering the entire material on record and the case of present applicant is in parity with those who have already been granted bail.
7. This Court also finds that the applicant-accused has remained in custody for a considerable period of time and that the trial/proceedings are likely to take further time to conclude. Therefore, looking to the entirety of the facts and circumstances of the case and without expressing any opinion on the merits thereof, this Court deems it appropriate to grant bail to the applicant-accused.
8. Thus, the instant bail application filed on behalf of applicant-accused **Ramniwas S/o Imarta Ram**, is hereby allowed and the applicant-accused is ordered to be released on bail upon furnishing a personal bond of ₹50,000/- with two

sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Trial Court with the following conditions:-

- (i) The applicant-accused shall not tamper with evidence or influence the witness in any manner.
- (ii) The applicant-accused shall not indulge in any criminal activity and shall not repeat any criminal offence punishable under the Law.
- (iii) The applicant-accused shall attend the hearing of the Trial Court on the date fixed by the Trial court or as and when asked to appear before the Trial Court.
- (iv) In case of any violation of above conditions, the bail granted to the applicant-accused shall be liable to be canceled.
