This application for bail under Section 483 BNSS has been filed by the petitioner, who has been arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.181/2026 registered at Police Station, Jawaharnagar, District Sri Ganganagar for the offence under Section 8/22 of NDPS Act and Section 223(b) of BNS, 2023.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that recovery affected from petitioner and co-accused Gurmeet Singh is of contraband Tramadol weighing 51 Grams, which is very much below the prescribed commercial quantity as provided in the Schedule appended to NDPS Act. It is submitted that co-accused Gurmeet Singh has already been enlarged on bail by this Court vide order dated 15.6.2026 in S.B. Criminal Misc. Bail Application

No.6237/2026. So far as pendency of cases is concerned, there are two cases pertaining to NDPS Act and one under various IPC offences. Furthermore, petitioner-Deepak Kumar has been acquitted by learned trial court vide order dated 04.7.2020 in one of the NDPS cases and it is alleged that he has been falsely implicated. The petitioner is behind bars since 28.4.2026. The trial of case will take a sufficiently long time, therefore, benefit of bail may be granted to the petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor opposed the bail application.

Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the material available on record.

Having considered the rival submissions, facts and circumstances of the case; recovery being below commercial quantity; co-accused having been enlarged on bail; keeping in view of the fact that conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner fleeing away from justice, in case he is enlarged on bail; but, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 BNSS is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Deepak Kumar S/o Raja Ram Nayak** arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.181/2026 registered at Police Station, Jawaharnagar, District Sri Ganganagar shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/-

and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that court on each & every date of hearing and whenever called upon to do so till completion of the trial.
