This application for bail under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) has been filed by the petitioner who has been arrested in connection with F.I.R. No.693/2025 registered at Police Station Anupgarh, District Sri Ganganagar, for offences under Sections 331(3) and 305(A) of BNS

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the offences alleged to have been committed by the petitioner are triable by court of Magistrate and charge-sheet has already been filed. It is stated that although 17 cases are alleged to be pending against the petitioner but, however it is argued that in as many as 8-9 cases petitioner has already been acquitted and hence, it is stated that the petitioner is falsely implicated in the cases. Learned counsel submitted that the petitioner is in judicial custody

since 11.03.2026 and the trial of the case will take sufficiently long time, therefore, the benefit of bail may be granted to the accused-petitioner.

Per contra, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the bail application.

Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the material available on record. The charge-sheet has already been filed. It is stated that although 17 cases are alleged to be pending against the petitioner but, however it is argued that in as many as 8-9 cases petitioner has already been acquitted. The petitioner is in judicial custody since 11.03.2026.

Having considered the rival submissions, facts and circumstances of the case; the alleged offences are triable by a Magistrate; keeping in view of the fact that conclusion of the trial of the case is likely to take time and the prosecution has not shown any apprehension of the petitioner fleeing away from justice, in case he is enlarged on bail; but, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant bail to the petitioner under Section 483 of BNSS.

Consequently, the bail application under Section 483 BNSS (439 Cr.P.C.) is allowed. It is ordered that the accused-petitioner **Abhishek Alias Ankit S/o Surendra Kumar** arrested in connection with FIR No.693/2025 registered at Police Station Anupgarh, District Sri Ganganagar, shall be released on bail, if not wanted in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond of Rs.50,000/- and two sureties of Rs.25,000/- each, to the satisfaction of learned trial court, for his appearance before that
